#### Fr. David Hiller Fund High School Scholarship

Once again, the Fr. David Hiller Fund will offer two (2) \$3,000 grants to children of **active** Kolping parents. At least one parent must be a member for at least three years. Grants are available for children who will be freshmen at a Greater Cincinnati Catholic high school in the school year 2019-2020. These grants will be renewable for each successive school year, provided certain conditions are met.

In 2019, the grants will be awarded to the two freshman students. Current grant recipients are also required to reapply in order to receive their renewable grants. Applications and program description are available in the Hiller Fund mail slot in the Kolping Board room. Applications should be sent directly to the Cincinnati Scholarship Foundation, who will determine the awardees. The applications are not provided to the members of the FDHF Committee.

#### German Emigration Museum Oral History Workshops

A team of four delegates from the German Emigration Museum (GEC) in Bremerhaven, Germany conducted oral history workshops on December 12 and 13 at the German Heritage Museum and at Elder High School.

The team arrived on December 11 and set up their lights and video cameras in the basement, first and second floors of the museum. A total of ten German-Americans of the first and third generations were interviewed, three at a time. These video interviews lasted between one and a half to two hours.

In addition, two of the interviewers conducted a workshop with students from Karin Albrecht's German class at Elder High School.

On Wednesday evening at 7:30 P.M., historian Katie Heidsiek from the GEC gave a presentation on the German-American Migration as Recorded in Oral Histories Experience in the Kolping Klubhaus. This presentation was very well attended, not just by Kolping members, but also by members of the Hamilton County German Genealogy Group.

Overall, it went well and we are proud that Cincinnati was chosen as one of only three cities for this project; the other two cities were Baltimore and Washington, D.C.



## WELCOME, NEW KOLPING MEMBER CLASS OF 2019!

We are glad that you have joined the Kolping Family and we look forward to working with you and seeing you at many of the Kolping events. The seventeenth Schützenfest sponsor that we are highlighting in the E-mail version of our newsletter is Servatii Pastry Shop & Deli.



Wilhelm Gottenbusch, a German immigrant, came to the United States after traveling around the world on an international freighter. In 1963, Wilhelm opened his first bakery on Observatory Avenue in Hyde Park. In a one-man shop, with a bakery in the back, he made a name for himself by focusing on one thing – quality. Focusing on the quality of his products, Wilhelm and his sons have expanded and grown over the last 50 years.

Wilhelm brought the traditions of his father and grandfather over from Münster, Germany. His grandfather, George, started out driving a horse-drawn wagon door-to-door selling his fresh baked goods. Wilhelm's father, George, attended Germany's most recognizable baking school and received his "Konditor Meister" status – Master Pastry Chef. His father opened Café Servatii, on Servatii Platz, in the heart of Münster, Germany. Wilhelm followed in his father's footsteps by earning his "Master Baker" status and starting his own business in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Wilhelm's sons, Gary and Greg, have both apprenticed in Germany earning their journeyman status – Greg in pastry and Gary in baking. Gary continued in his father and grandfather's footsteps by earning his Master Baker certification in 2001. In turn, the Gottenbusch's have acquired some of the most talented bakers, decorators and pastry chefs in America. All together, they work to uphold the values set forth by Wilhelm Gottenbusch 50 years ago.
