In Memoriam, Fr. Bruno Kremp, OFM



Our dear former Praeses, Fr. Bruno Manfred Kremp, OFM, left this earth to meet the Lord on January 25, 2020 at the age of 82. He became our Praeses on October 1, 1991, succeeding longtime Praeses, Fr. David Hiller, who had become too ill to continue in the position. Fr. Bruno retired as Kolping Praeses on August 28, 2017 due to health issues.

Born Manfred Kremp, the only child of Oskar and Maria Kremp, in Stuttgart, Germany on February 24, 1937, Manfred was separated from his parents for two years during World War II at the age of 6. He lost his grandmother and an uncle to bombing raids and his father was a prisoner of war. After the war was over, Manfred and his parents immigrated to the U.S. and settled in Cincinnati.

Manfred entered St. Francis Seminary in 1952 and became a Franciscan novice in 1956, receiving the religious name Bruno. He was ordained in 1965. He served in many different areas of ministry, including parish ministry at St. Clement, Corpus Christi, St. George, St. Francis Seraph and St. Bonaventure parishes; chaplain at Deaconess and Mercy Western Hills hospitals; a judge in the Archdiocesan Marriage Tribunal; Vocation Director for the Franciscans; an FBI chaplain; a member of the Disaster Response Team for Hamilton County; and a chaplain for the Hamilton County Sheriff's Office. May Fr. Bruno's soul rest in peace. We will miss him

Genealogy Group

The March 15th session will focus on the types of German census records summarized in a new book by Dr. Roger P. Minert. His latest masterpiece focuses on German Census Records 1816-1916 and was just published in 2016. The first four chapters review the History of Census Records in the German States, the 1867 Great Transition, the Records of the German Empire from 1871-1918 and concludes with a review of Census Records in the German States from 1816 to 1864. The next 40+ chapters highlight each duchy/ state/kingdom/principality/free city/province beginning with Anhalt and Baden through Westpreußen and Württemberg. offering specific information research in these places. The last few chapters conclude on What Do We Know Now?, Writing to Archives in Germany, France and Poland, and actually conducting census research in these same places.
