Note from Fr. Dan, Our Praeses

In the early 1980s I met some Franciscan priests from the Cincinnati province. One, Carl Kemphues, was from Cincinnati. He was my mentor when I was first trying to find my life in rural pastoral ministry. We were assigned together on Maripipi Island, a dormant volcano island with about 3,500 residents. I learned a lot from Carl about the local language and culture. We shared some exciting adventures. Carl taught me how to watch out for sharks and for the ever-present sea urchins and jellyfish with their painful stings. Carl had been a machine gunner and saw a lot of battle, from Normandy to the crossing of the Rhine.

The other friar I met in the Philippines had served in the armored division and served as a tank gunner in battles in France and Germany. His name was Malachy Brogan. He looked like an Irish version of some famous actor in the movies of the 1960s. I was never assigned with Malachy, but I was very impressed by him when he gave a retreat at our minor seminary here in Cincinnati. He was a very contemplative friar who spent a few years in trying out the Trappist way of life in a monastery in the Philippines before joining a contemplative community of friars in the mountains of northern Luzon.

Both these men visited Padre Pio in the days after the war, but before they were discharged from active duty and brought back to the States. They both liked to talk more about their visits to Padre Pio than they did about their years in the war. Both became Franciscans after their years serving our country. I found myself thinking about them as I remembered Padre Pio and prepared to preach for the feast of Padre Pio on September 23. What impressed me about these two friars was their stories about their visits to Padre Pio. Both these friars went to Confession to Padre Pio. Both told me of the great peace they felt after all the horrors of war. They felt healed – forgiven. Once they both made their ways home, both entered religious life and trained to be priests. Both were dedicated, holy men.

I write about these two friars whose lives were touched by Padre Pio. Just thinking about them reminds me of the people who were touched by their witness and their ministry. They have gone to their heavenly reward. I hope that all of us, as members of the Kolping family, continue to live the life modeled for us by our families and by the example of Fr. Kolping. Always remember that we are to be witnesses to Christ by living the virtues modeled for us by Blessed Adolph Kolping. Fr. Dan

Fire up that computer for another virtual meeting. Click 'Join' when the clock approaches 2:00 pm on Sunday, October 18. Be sure and contact Tom Montgomery at <u>montgota@fuse.net</u> to get an invitation. We can send out a link. You can use the camera and microphone on the newer laptops or feel free to just phone in as well. You can see the presentation on a smartphone, but the screen is small for older eyes (like mine).

We will be taking a break from specific topics and reviewing the more general German Genealogy Cheat Sheets. <u>Three</u> topics on Oct. 18 follow up on the specific Catholic Church Records held in *Matricula*, reviewed on September 20; these are:

- **Parish Church Records**: focus on only one site: <u>https://www.archion.de/</u> and looking at a few *Kirchenbuchduplikate* or church book duplicates.
- **Civil Registration**: we will be searching for *Standesamt (civil registration office).*
- Village Family Histories: the BEST reference is a family book from your Heimat. These are published compilations of church and civil records. They're organized by family group, with each person given a number that creates a cross-referencing system in the book. Some of us Kolping members have such a *Familienbuch*. We will tour the German website <u>compgen.de</u> and search.

Following the presentation, we always chat and exchange information and take questions and consultation on members' research.

Kolping History Corner

The Kolping Schützen Club

by Nancy Pelzel Excerpts from Making a Difference: A History of the Catholic Kolping Society of Cincinnati

The first Cincinnati Kolping Schützen Club was organized in June of 1959, with its purpose being "to promote a greater interest in our Schützenfest and to improve and work out a more efficient program of activities for this important affair." The first officers of the club were: Henry Gerbus, President; Herman Mollmann, Vice President; and George Birn, Executive Secretary. In addition, there was a Board of Directors consisting of: Gus Kaiser, John H. Schulte, Fred Wernke, Tom Schottelkotte, and Bill Janszen. The officers of the club, along with two members of the Ladies Auxiliary and two girls from Young Kolping, formed the Schützenfest Committee to plan the Schützenfest for that year.

This all seemed very official, but for some reason, it appears that the first club disbanded, since in the Kolping meeting minutes of March, 1961, it was stated, "Motion was made and seconded to organize a **new** Schützen Club." Harry Talkers organized the second start of the club, patterning it after the shooting clubs in Germany. It was established that there would be a shooting match on the third Friday of every month, and the first match was on September 21, 1962. The cost was \$1.25 per man, which covered the cost of the shooting and free beer. By 1969, there were nineteen teams, and by 1985, there were twenty-nine.

The Schützen Club was in charge of the annual Kolping Easter Egg Hunt from at least 1972 through 1994, but there was no mention of the club sponsoring this event after 1994. Another interesting tidbit of information is that the Schützen Club sponsored a Youth Group starting in 1974 for children ages ten to sixteen. They shot under the guidance of their parents and senior members. It's not clear how long this lasted, but by 2003, children were no longer permitted to be in attendance.

Membership in the Club has fluctuated over the years, with as many as thirty-six teams around 2010. Currently, there are twenty-five teams signed up, with shooting having started up again on September 18, 2020. Each team consists of five members using .22-caliber rifles, and they may have substitutes to shoot for an absent team member, with the substitute having to be a Kolping member. The goal for each team member is to shoot the highest score of the night to be eligible for an award at the end of the year. The scores range from a minimum of 59 to a perfect score of 72. To achieve a perfect score, a member must put six out of eight bullets in the bullseye.

The current officers of the Club are: Steve Lawson, President; Matt Brunsman, Vice President; Mike Brunsman, Treasurer; Eric Denoma, Secretary. The Schützen Club still meets monthly on the third Friday of the month from September through May. Practice shooting begins at 7:00 P.M. and goes until 8:00 P.M., with an award for the highest practice shooter. Competition starts at 8:00 P.M. and goes until all teams have shot.

The camaraderie in the Club is as much an element of the draw in membership as the competition. It gives everyone an opportunity to get together and engage in some friendly competition, while having a social night out. New members are always welcome!
