



#### Message from Fr. Dan, Our Praeses

We start the Advent season on Sunday, November 28. What does the Advent season mean to you? Take a moment to ponder that question as you remember your experiences of Christmases past.

Probably the first thing that comes to mind is the fact that after Thanksgiving we start planning for Christmas. Maybe we think about joining the millions who will travel to visit family and celebrate this feast. Tickets and reservations come to mind. Then there are gifts to buy and wrap, decorations and lights to display. Christmas music and carols and stories can create warm sentiments in our hearts.

Yet, I hope some inkling of spiritual preparation for the feast of Christmas also arises in our hearts. Perhaps childhood memories stream into our consciousness. It is OK to grow sentimental. Pay attention to those things that build and revitalize our spirits.

I admire parents who bring their children to visit crib displays. It helps kids to learn about prayer and it deepens their understanding that Christmas means the birth of Christ, God's love made visible in human life. Mary, Joseph and the infant Jesus in the crib scene implant memories that endure. Christmas carols, lights and trees are rich manifestations of the spirit and meaning of Christmas.

Advent is a Latin term for this liturgical season designated by the church as the time to prepare our hearts for the coming feast of Christmas—the birth of Christ—and for the end of time. So Advent is a time to ponder and share the love of God in human life and time. We do well to prepare for the feast of the incarnation—the manifestation of Emmanuel—God with us. Jesus is with us, in our families and homes, if we live in faith and answer his call to share God's love every day of the year. Prepare the way of the Lord throughout this beautiful season of faith.

### Fr. David Hiller Fund Offering Grants

Once again, the Father David Hiller Fund will offer two (2) \$3,000 grants for children of active Kolping parents who will be attending Catholic high schools in the Tri-State area. At least one parent must be a member for at least three years. Grants are available for children who will be freshmen at a Catholic high school in the school year 2022-2023. These grants will be renewable for each successive school year, provided certain conditions are met.

In 2022, the grants will be awarded to the two freshman students. Current grant recipients are also required to update their information in order to continue receiving their renewable grants. Applications and program description are available in the Hiller Fund mail slot in the Kolping copier room. Applications should be sent directly to the Cincinnati Scholarship Foundation, 324 E. 4<sup>th</sup> St., Cincinnati, OH 45202, who will determine the awardees. The applications are not provided to the members of the FDHF Committee. Deadline is **February 28, 2022**.


