Holy Mass on the 30th Anniversary of the Beatification of Adolph Kolping

Below is a letter from Dr. Markus Demele, the General Secretary of Kolping International:

Dear Kolping Sisters and Kolping Brothers all over the world,

Actually we wanted to celebrate the 30th anniversary of the beatification of Adolph Kolping together in Rome with a pilgrimage, just as it happened ten and twenty years ago. Like so many other things, the Coronavirus pandemic has made this impossible.

But we will still celebrate with gratitude the World Day of Prayer on October 31, 2021 at 2 p.m. German time (9:00 a.m. Cincinnati time) in the Church of Minorites in Cologne with a Holy Mass and broadcast it with many cameras all over the world. [Editor's note: Europe changes the clocks back during the night on October 31, but the U.S. does this on November 7; thus on October 31, there is only a 5-hour difference between Cincinnati and Germany time.)

www.kolping.net/en/world-day-of-prayer/ not only to find all the information about the celebration of the Holy Service, but also to start the live stream on the day itself and thus to be present simultaneously around the globe in Cologne at the tomb of Blessed Adolph Kolping.

Message from Fr. Dan, Our Praeses

Next week is our annual pre-initiation session before initiation in December. I always enjoy this session because it brings new members into our Kolping family's tradition. Among other things, what I deeply enjoy, is the chance to reflect on Fr. Kolping's motto. His motto covers a range of things that all members of our organization pledge to live in our daily lives. His motto is broad and challenges us.

- 1) Religion and Virtue
- 2) Industry and Diligence
- 3) Harmony and Charity
- 4) Cheerfulness and Fun

It is the fourth element that I always want to emphasize—cheerfulness and fun! This element of the motto is something that can't be overstated or overemphasized in today's context.

Why do I say that? Simply put, the motto's first three points are something that we would expect in any Catholic or Christian organization. Being serious about our faith and living it, are expected in all members of a Catholic organization like ours.

However, think about it in Kolping's context. When Fr. Kolping founded our organization, times were tough. The Industrial Revolution was messing up prior social relationships. Workers were suffering at the mercy of the rich and powerful owners. That is why Fr. Kolping worked hard to help the tradesmen protect their rights and demand justice. His was serious, dangerous work, and he pushed hard against the trends of his time.

Yet, in the midst of all the difficulties and heavy pastoral work, Fr. Kolping included "Cheerfulness and Fun" among the elements in his motto. Somehow that element always seems so atypical for a German Catholic priest at that time. Ponder that element and remember that our Kolping family here in Cincinnati must work hard to make this element of his motto apparent in our spirit.



Kolping Genealogy Maps & Google Earth

We will meet virtually on **Sunday, October 10 at 2:00 pm** for an hour. The first part of the meeting will focus on Maps and using *Google Earth* in your genealogical research. The rest of the time is spent one-on-one working with each other on capturing our information and expanding our skill sets.

A subtopic on October 10 will be "Finding your Heimat" using this technology. You have to learn the location of your "home village" in order to facilitate most German research. We will compare *Google Earth* to *Google Maps* (using the two villages of my Weber family as an example) and learn to search "Germany" using both apps to find your ancestors' homes. Armed with the address and village, you can "pin" these locations in *Earth* and share with others. *Maps* gives us distances to trek, bike, or drive. Both Google Maps and Google Earth are free.

So login with your own laptop and standby to review digital maps and research on Germany's geography. This is a great opportunity for brother/sister members of Kolping to share their research; fellow Tuesday Workers to share their immigration stories, marksmen and choir members to locate those places where they or their ancestors learned their trades.

Basic Geography will cover the present-day German States and look back into historical regions and administrative divisions. We will look at a few of the many online gazetteers and some of the best online historical maps. Maps are fun to view and give us a perspective most useful in our research. Our forefathers would be amazed to see "Street View" of the old home place. Visit from your home with a cold drink and favorite chair.

All programs this year for German-American Heritage Month are at the German Heritage Museum, 4764 West Fork Road, Cincinnati, Ohio 45247. Note: face masks are required inside the museum for all regardless of vaccination status.

Sunday, October 10 – A Civil War Encampment, organized by the Ninth Ohio: A Living History Regiment, will take place from 1 to 5 p.m. The Ninth Ohio Infantry Regiment was one of several German regiments formed in Cincinnati during the Civil War, and its camp life will be presented by Civil War reenactors. Also, there will be an Oktoberfest diorama presented by David Dalton.

Sunday, Oct. 17 – "Food and Drink in the Ninth Ohio Regiment during the Civil War," presented by Andrew Houghthaling at 2 p.m.

Sunday, Oct. 24 - German Heritage Book Talk & Signing, presented by Dr. Don Heinrich Tolzmann, at 2 p.m. The author will discuss his most recent book *The Cincinnati Germans before World War I*. Copies of his other books will also be available.
