

Kolping Genealogy

We will meet "live" at Kolping at 2:00 pm on this our regular third Sunday, December 18. It will actually be a hybrid session, broadcasting using Zoom. We will take up the topic of the scientific and genealogical implications of DNA testing. "I have my results now, what to do next" is our topic.

My Miami colleague, Dr. Andor Kiss, will be joining us in the Clubhouse to answer any scientific questions visitors may have. We may have time to review *DNA Painter* and discuss "confidence levels" used in testing. Andor is an Adjunct Assistant Professor in Microbiology and the Director of the Center for Bioinformatics at Miami. He understands the science very well.

I hope to focus on Ethnicity Results and help us to understand relative (cousin) matches and circles. Both of us will be focusing on how to interpret your DNA test results, using Ancestry DNA as an example. Ancestry compares your DNA with all other DNA tests (the largest pool) and we get a "total centimorgan" shared relationship in our personal reports.

Fr. David Hiller Fund Grants

Once again, the Father David Hiller Fund will offer two (2) \$3,000 grants for children of active Kolping parents who will be attending Catholic high schools in the Tri-State area. At least one parent must be a member for at least three years. Grants are available for children who will be freshmen at a Catholic high school in the school year 2023- 2024. These grants will be renewable for each successive school year provided certain conditions are met.

In 2023, the grants will be awarded to two freshman students. Current grant recipients are also required to update their information in order to continue receiving their renewable grants. Applications and program description will be available in the Hiller Fund mail slot in the Kolping copier room. Applications should be sent directly to the Cincinnati Scholarship Foundation, 324 E. 4th St., Cincinnati, OH 45202, who will determine the awardees. The applications are not provided to the members of the FDHF committee. Deadline is **February 28, 2023**. Message from Our President, Anna Stukenborg

Dearest Kolping Family,

This first year as your president has gone so quickly! 2022 has been a busy and productive year; it was the first full year that the Kolping Soccer Club managed Kolping Park, The German Singer group is growing and can be heard breaking out into song at events all over the city, we had the most successful Schüzenfest ever, the Kolping Women's Klub was started, we hosted the National Convention (at long last), and we have continued to update and remodel our property. All of these things have been accomplished by the dedication of our awesome volunteers.

Since our Capital Fund Drive in 2020, it has been made acutely apparent that some gaps needed to be filled on the business management side of our society. Questions were being asked like: "Why is my donation to Kolping Society not tax-deductible?", and "How can we be more financially stable and not rely so heavily on Schützenfest and other fundraisers to pay the bills?".

These are great questions, and are worth answering. Firstly, Kolping Society currently holds two liquor licenses, one at Kolping Center and one at Kolping Park. Holding these liquor licenses is what prevents us from being able to take tax-deductible donations, and let's face it, Kolping without beer and schnapps, well, it wouldn't be the same! The second question can be answered with two words: endowment fund. An endowment fund is a "nest egg" of funds that is added to, but never touched. Eventually, the interest earnings from the fund could generate enough income to at least heavily supplement our other income sources (like fundraisers and event rentals).

In order to solve these two dilemmas, the Kolping leadership team has established a new entity, owned by Catholic Kolping Society of Cincinnati, called The Kolping Foundation of Cincinnati. The charter of this organization is to raise funds to support the current and future programs and facilities of the Catholic Kolping Society of Cincinnati. This new organization has its own Board of Directors, appointed by the Kolping Society President, and its own trustees. The two main functions of the Foundation will be raising funds for general use and raising funds that will be invested in an endowment fund. We applied to the IRS for tax exemption status under code 501(c)3 for the foundation. This process usually takes months, and it was approved in 11 days! We were truly blessed! The Kolping Foundation of Cincinnati provides us the opportunity to receive tax-deductible donations, create an endowment fund for financial stability in the future, and it also allows us to seek other funding, such as grant money for our programs and facility. We will be mailing out more information about the foundation soon.

Starting in 2023, partnered with a group of preferred caterers and vendors, we will be taking on managing the event rentals in-house. We will be holding a Grand Re-Opening of The Kolping Haus (formerly Kolping Center) after the first of the year. This will be such a great opportunity for us to share our story with our community and to provide a welcoming place to hold life's special celebrations.











