Tuesday Workers: A Sixty Year Tradition

The purpose of this article is to make an appeal. I am sure every Kolping member is aware of our rich German heritage. This point is not lost on our current Tuesday Workers. Many of our Tuesday Workers are first generation Americans. Sadly, we lose more and more of these treasured individuals each year. A recent poll of the 20 to 25 who show up each week showed that the average age of a Tuesday Worker is 72.5 years. Some of the workers are in their 80s and two are in their 90s. Although they may have lost some of the youthful bounce in their step, they have certainly not lost their exuberance and love of Kolping!

99% of Tuesday Workers are retired; 95% are men. I am asking for a commitment from any Kolping member who is willing and able to join the Tuesday Workers and help honor the tradition started by the founders of this group. This appeal is to ALL Kolping members, men and women, retired or not. Tuesday Workers start at 9 A.M. and work until 2 or 3 PM. A lunch is served at noon. We task ourselves with grass cutting, trimming, landscaping, electric, plumbing, carpentry, painting, cleaning and any other task needed to keep our facility one of the best around and to honor those to whom the Cincinnati Kolping has meant so much.

Some of our workers are only able to commit to part of the day. Their time is greatly appreciated and valued. You do not have to be mechanically inclined or a skilled laborer, although we definitely could use those skills. We do, however, take great pride in our WORK ETHIC! If Kolping has meant something to you or your family and you are looking to give back, this might be the way! Thank You and God Bless! Rick Janzen

Message from Fr. Dan, Our Praeses

Jan 21st was the National Right to Life March in Washington, D.C. I was here at our Franciscan Media office in Cincinnati doing my daily duties, like writing this column. Concern and activism for the right to life has been part of our Catholic lives for almost fifty years now.

We often receive letters and phone calls here in which people complain that Franciscan Media is too liberal or too conservative because we report about the church, its good work, and its shortcomings. That is part of religious publishing today. "Why do you report about clergy abuse?" "Why do you publish critical views about racism?" "It is un-American to oppose the nuclear arms race." "Why does the pope show so much concern for immigrants?"

I mention these matters because Fr. Kolping had to endure a lot of difficulties in the pastoral work that he did. Because of his commonsense approach to the suffering of workers caused by the Industrial Revolution, Father Kolping had to be courageous and very careful. The Catholic Church, Protestants and other religions were all struggling to find their way. There were tremendous social tensions between the extremes of communism and unbridled capitalism.

In that context, Father Kolping eventually developed our organization. Today we call it the Kolping Society. Then it worked to help the workers who lost so much during his time. What skilled workers like shoemakers, tailors, metal workers and small farmers could do to earn a living could then be done by factories and machines for lower cost, though often the products were of lesser quality than the work of skilled guild members. That was the age of the Industrial Revolution.

Today the Church must struggle with new social issues. The late Cardinal Bernardin called for living a seamless value of life, not only on the issue of legal abortion, but also on such issues as racism, war, capital punishment, nuclear weapons, global warming, and the destruction of our environment. In thinking about the value of life involved in the Right to Life campaign, I feel we do well to reflect carefully on the ethical stance outlined by Cardinal Bernardin. He pointed to other issues that we also need to oppose abortion. Unfortunately, Cardinal Bernardin was not able to convince all the U.S. bishops on this matter.

Message from Fr. Dan (cont'd.)

Now I point to another example. Archbishop John Wester of Santa Fe, New Mexico, recently published "Living in the Light of Christ's Peace," which is subtitled as "A Conversation Toward Nuclear Disarmament." This pastoral letter is an invitation to the members of his archdiocese and to all Americans, to work for an end of the nuclear weapons race, which is a huge budgetary issue for all the nuclear powers. So please ponder these matters and expand your heart and soul with me.

Fr. David Hiller Fund Offering Grants


