
Welcome, New Kolping Members!

Message from Fr. Dan, Our Praeses

As I write this message for the *Bulletin*, there is a lovely crèche atop the lateral file cabinets across from my office at Franciscan Media. It just appeared while I was eating lunch. A crib set is quite appropriate here at our office for Franciscan Media. Why? Because St. Francis of Assisi gathered the people of Greccio around a live nativity scene for Mass one Christmas night. The Saint loved to celebrate the birth of Christ and invented the Christmas crib as a means of evangelizing the people of the area.

"Divine humility and humble sublimity" is the way Francis described the birth of Christ. The times were cold as were the hearts of the people. He wanted to enkindle the fire of Divine Love and warm the hearts of the humble folks who gathered at that first crib scene.

Often, during Christmas time, I see families who come to pray at the crib. Parents teach their little ones about the crib and the coming of Christ into human life. St. Francis saw clearly that it is in human beings that Christ comes to us in our daily lives.

To this day, the Christmas Crèche always touches something deep in our hearts; namely, the way in which God chose to be born in such a humble abode as a stable which gave shelter to domestic animals. The crib in Greccio brought people to understand the great humility of God and God's love for us.

Having a crib set in our family home was one of the ways my parents and family taught us about the meaning of the birth of Jesus—the Incarnation. The Lord still teaches us how to recognize God present in all our brothers and sisters. Hopefully you have been learning about the meaning of the Incarnation when you have encountered the Lord in your neighbors. That is what happened in the life of Blessed Adolph Kolping, our patron and namesake.

Fr. David Hiller Fund Offering Grants

Once again, the Father David Hiller Fund will offer two (2) \$3,000 grants for children of active Kolping parents who will be attending Catholic high schools in the Tri-State area. At least one parent must be a member for at least three years. Grants are available for children who will be freshmen at a Catholic high school in the school year 2022-2023. These grants will be renewable for each successive school year, provided certain conditions are met.

In 2022, the grants will be awarded to the two freshman students. Current grant recipients are also required to update their information in order to continue receiving their renewable grants. Applications and program description are available in the Hiller Fund mail slot in the Kolping copier room. Applications should be sent directly to the Cincinnati Scholarship Foundation, 324 E. 4th St., Cincinnati, OH 45202, who will determine the awardees. The applications are not provided to the members of the FDHF Committee. Deadline is **February 28, 2022**.

2nd New Member Initiation




