Message from Fr. Dan, Our Praeses

Jesus ascended to heaven and now sits at the right hand of the Father. We believe that he will come again to judge the living and the dead. That is a major article of our faith. We profess it regularly at Sunday Mass, but I must admit, I am often distracted.

We members of the Kolping family should remember that the Lord will judge us at the end of our days. This statement of our Catholic creed is often neglected, until we face our own death. That is why great saints encouraged their disciples to remember that no one can escape Sister Death, as St. Francis liked to call it.

Recently, as most of you probably know, I was hospitalized for three days for what may have been a stroke. All the tests proved that I had no signs of a stroke. However, I may have suffered dehydration after a series of attacks of diarrhea. All of this led me to reflect on my experience years ago.

I remember when I was teaching at Roger Bacon High School back in the 1970s. I developed appendicitis. I recall lying on a hospital gurney before the surgery thinking thoughts of doom. What if I have a reaction to the anesthesia or develop a major infection due to the surgery? A chaplain came by, a priest I personally knew. He asked if I would like to be anointed. Naturally, I said yes. I was grateful for the anointing. I noticed how relaxed I felt after the anointing.

The surgery went well. I was released from the hospital the second day. Post-op I developed a stubborn bronchial infection that caused frequent coughing. Every cough made me feel sharp abdominal pain around the sutured wound. Fortunately, antibiotic treatment cured the infection within the week, but I had to admit that cough brought tears to my eyes. It embarrassed me when I returned to the classroom after five days. That cough destroyed my macho pretensions. Moral of the story? Face whatever difficulty comes my way, and don't be afraid to admit weakness. Facing illness meant being painfully aware of my own mortality then and now.

As we all get older, it is good to remember that we need to admit our limits and face our mortality. Sooner or later we all must face Sister Death. May our faith lead us to accept whatever comes our way.

Kolping Genealogy

The NEW Genealogy: DNA Research

Genealogy is simply the study of one's family tree or ancestry. What is Genetic Genealogy? *Genetic* Genealogy uses DNA testing to determine the genetic relationship between individuals.

Why would someone want to use DNA for genealogy? There are many reasons but here are a few of the most common:

- To learn more about one's ancestry
- To confirm that one's family tree reflects one's actual ancestry
- To confirm the relationship between two people
- To validate a theory of where people came from
- To break down a brick wall in one's genealogy research
- To find relatives for those that were adopted, gave up a child for adoption, or otherwise do not know their ancestry
- To learn from which ancestor(s) certain traits were inherited


