Message from Fr. Dan, Our Praeses

Ash Wednesday is just around the corner on March 2, when we Catholics receive blessed ashes as a tangible sign of our desire for spiritual renewal.

The ritual has two options for the distribution of ashes. The traditional, "Remember that you are dust and unto dust you shall return." And the new one, "Repent and believe the Good News." The minister of ashes may use either form. There is something fundamental in both forms because of the spiritual meaning symbolized by ashes.

Catholic tradition associates the Lenten Season with prayer, fasting and works of mercy—such as giving alms to the poor, serving in works of mercy organized at parishes, or helping neighbors who are sick or disabled. In the past the focus was on "giving up" something for Lent. Adults were obliged to fast during Lent and abstain from meat every Friday. Children were urged to give up candy. Today the focus is not so much on "giving up" something for Lent, as on reaching out in service to our brothers and sisters in need.

I remember going around all day with the cross signed on my forehead when I was a child, but that was nothing compared to our parish custom of attending the Way of the Cross and Benediction every Sunday. Also, there were extra choir practices to prepare for the celebration of Holy Week and Easter.

Last year, in his Lenten message, Pope Francis made an interesting summary of the purpose and meaning of Lent.

In our Lenten journey towards Easter, let us remember the One who "humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross" (*Phil* 2:8). During this season of conversion, let us renew our *faith*, draw from the "living water" of *hope*, and receive with open hearts the *love* of God, who makes us brothers and sisters in Christ.

Pope Francis wants us to focus on Christ's ultimate sacrifice on the cross. He means feeling compassion towards the wounds of Christ visible today in the victims of war, in attacks on all stages of life, from that of the unborn to that of the elderly, and forms of violence. Pope Francis says that "... the wounds of Christ are also present in environmental disasters, the unequal distribution of the earth's goods, human trafficking in all its forms, and the unbridled thirst for profit, which is a form of idolatry."

If all the world could see things the Pope's way, we would be moving towards the Reign of God.

Message from Our President

Dear Kolping Family,

As we quickly approach the Lenten Season the two words that come to my mind are humility and gratitude. Personally, I am humbled by God's grace and love, and I am deeply grateful for everything He has done for me. As I reflect on our Kolping family, I am humbled by the accomplishments of those who have led before me and I am so grateful for the Kolping family that we have!

Being good stewards of what we have been blessed with is such an important part of gratitude. That being said, we are wrapping up our Capital Fund Drive that we began this time last year. I want to thank everyone who donated not only monetarily, but with their time, talents, resources, and prayers. We collected a total of \$162,140 in cash and pledges. With that money, combined with the time and talents of the Tuesday Workers, the House and Grounds Committee, and other dedicated volunteers, we were able to accomplish the following:

- The parking lot lights were replaced with energy efficient LED lights.
- The hall lights were replaced with energy efficient LED lights.
- Year-round restrooms were built in the Kolping Park building, now being used by the Soccer Club.
- The pavilion restrooms have a new epoxy floor, all new toilets, and will be getting a new roof soon.
- Brides and Grooms using Kolping Center for their big day have lovely rooms to gather and get ready.
- We have a new Copy Room and a new Treasurer's Office.
- We have ordered 500 new chairs for the Halls (arriving soon!).
- The parking lot has been repaired and is scheduled to be sealed and re-lined in the spring.
- We purchased a new 72" zero-turn mower.
- The garage and pavilion will be getting new roofs soon.
- Coming this spring- the front of Kolping Center will be freshened up with new paint and landscaping.

That is quite a list! Thank you to everyone!

March is such a busy month at Kolping-Fish Fries, Soccer Tournament, Schützenfest planning, King's Ball, and the Mass for St. Joseph. Let's make an extra effort to not get distracted and to follow Blessed Fr. Kolping's tireless example of humility and gratitude!
