Gene Bertke, husband of the late Mary (nee Fritsch) Bertke and Kolping member for 39 years, passed away on November 4, 2023 at the age of 89. Gene was a member of the Kolping Sängerchor for many years and he helped in initiating its first Schlachtfest as a fundraiser for the group. He also was a member of the Financial Oversight Committee from 2002-2005, a member of the Kolping Golf League, and a member of the 90th Anniversary Committee. He received the Cincinnati Kolping Meritorious Service Award in 2003. We extend our sympathies to his children: Ken, Diana, Karen, Paul and Mary, and the rest of the Bertke family.

Ben Geers, husband of Magda (nee Anneken) Geers and Kolping member for 68 years, passed away on November 17, 2023 at the age of 94, just shy of his 95th birthday. Ben served on the Kolping Board of Directors three times; he helped build the St. Joseph Grotto at both the Winton Road and Mill Road Kolping facilities, as well as the Kolping Shelterhouse; he was an altar server for many of the Kolping Masses; a coach for the Sports Club; and was a member of the Kolping Band, the Tuesday Workers, the Schützen Club, the Kolping Golf League, the King's Club, and the 1994 Convention Committee. Ben was the leader and the drummer for the Polka Dots Band, and he became the Schützenfest King, along with his wife Magda as Queen, in 1980. He received the Cincinnati Kolping Meritorious Service Award in 1994 and the National Kolping Distinguished Service Award in 1996. Our thoughts and prayers go out to Magda and their children, Michael, Marianne, Connie, and Bernie, their daughter-in-law Maria, and the whole Geers family.

Message from Fr. Dan, Our Praeses

Christmas is just around the corner. May all our crib scenes remind us of the tender miracle of the incarnation. The Word became flesh and dwelt among us. No other religion professes such a belief.

At a little village called Greccio, St. Francis wanted to dramatically awaken the hearts and minds of the people to the importance of the incarnation. Francis called upon his friends to celebrate the birth of Christ by making a live crib scene as a place for their celebration of Christmas Mass.

I had a chance to experience such a live Christmas scene at a chapel in the rice fields of Mapuyo, a village in the town of Kawayan, Leyte in the Philippines. All the people took part according to their abilities. The chapel was overflowing. The young brought their musical talents. The farmers provided animals—goats, a water buffalo, a donkey, a couple dogs. Those who had pressure lanterns brought them to light up the chapel. Teenagers took the role of Mary and Joseph.

Mary entered the chapel riding a donkey led by Joseph. All the people sang. The goats stood outside the side door and bleated when their handlers tugged their tails. When Mary and Joseph reached the front of the chapel, they took their places by a crib in front of the altar. Then an angel carried an infant to Mary. The people sang the Glory for the dramatic reading of the Gospel. There was hardly a dry eye in the place. Of course, the water buffalo only observed things from a side door.

Saint Francis invented the Christmas crib. In his *Letter to the Entire Order,* Francis described Christ present in the Eucharist as "Sublime humility, humble sublimity." Those were his ways of helping his brothers and all the people of Greccio understand the great mystery of Jesus' birth.

May the Lord bless all Kolping members this Christmas.


