Message from Fr. Dan, Our Praeses

Thank you and congratulations to all members and volunteers who worked so diligently to make *Schützenfest 2023* a wonderful success! Quite a crowd turned out. The Lord blessed us with beautiful weather and moderate temperatures. Thanks to all the volunteers and donors who contributed so much time and treasure.

Now is the time to recall the work of Fr. Adolph Kolping. He rose from humble stock, always keeping his eye on living the faith he inherited. Though Adolph wanted higher education, that was out of the question. He was apprenticed to a shoemaker instead.

As a young man Adolph devoted time to prayer and study. When he became a journeyman shoemaker, he was disappointed with the morally degrading conditions he endured. When a family of means granted him the chance to attain his dreams, Adolph eventually was ordained a priest in Cologne (Köln).

His pastoral work brought him into the harsh economic realities of the Industrial Revolution. It brought about his deeper realization about what he was called to do. Rather than becoming a professor, the young priest increasingly saw that he was called to work with the poor and devoted himself to his pastoral work.

"The needs of the times will teach you what to do," wrote Fr. Kolping.* That was a couple years later as he worked with the young men who became members of the organization he founded. He tried to make Catholic social teachings well known, through his writings and publications. In the midst of the economic impact of the Industrial Revolution, Kolping's focus on justice and family eventually became the foundation of the Kolping families that he helped to establish in Europe.

So we stand on the foundational work of Fr. Kolping. May we continue that emphasis on family and justice today and in the years to come.


