From Care2Share

We are extremely grateful to the Cincinnati Kolping Society for granting us the use of the facility to conduct our fundraiser each year. For over 20 years, Kolping has approved our request each year to hold our fundraiser free of charge. In May 2023, the Board granted Care2Share the use of the hall on the second Saturday of each November gratis and in perpetuity. We are forever grateful to Kolping for your generosity. As Kolping members, we also feel like Care2Share's work is Kolping's charity work.

Care2Share was founded 24 years ago as a 501(c)(3) non-profit charitable organization to serve the poor and remote villages in Vietnam. Some of the projects include building childcare centers, houses, water cisterns, and safe drinking water filtration systems; providing scholarships and bikes for kids to go to school; lending help on farming projects and handicraft businesses. We have a dedicated and selfless local project manager at each village who executes these projects. These leaders are typically a Catholic priest or nun, or a Buddhist monk. Each year, our team of volunteers travels to these villages out-of-pocket to survey, collaborate and verify the projects' completion. Meanwhile, a portion of our traveling team, consisting of doctors, pharmacists and dentists, provides medical services at these villages that we serve.

At the October Kolping General Meeting, we plan to share a video of our April 2023 Vietnam mission. This year, our fundraising event will be on November 11th and Kolping members are welcomed. An invitation letter from Care2Share will be included in an upcoming *Kolping Bulletin*.



Kolping Genealogy

Join fellow genealogy beginners and advanced researchers for a second **FTM** session on this, our regular third Sunday, Sept. 17. We will meet in person at our Kolping Clubhouse at 2:00 pm. It will actually be a hybrid session, both live and broadcasting using Zoom. Guests are welcome. You do not need to be a Kolping member. <u>Feel free to bring your own laptop and research</u>.

Sunday, Sept. 17: Presenter Tom Montgomery will review some additional super-feature aspects of the computer genealogical software known as Family Tree Maker 2019. Tom has adopted it as it is one of the more powerful, vet user friendly family tree packages on the market (www.techradar.com/best/genealogy-tools). The package was reviewed at Kolping on May 21 (http://www.kolpingcincinnati.com/Genealogy/Gen ealogy.html) but users want more details on the package and requested a second session. We will look at Places and People.



FTM offers fantastic menu choices. As you enter your locations, they are recorded in **Places** (third menu across the top of the program). Crisp Road and Aerial views are standard (there is access to online street and satellite maps; some sites have Bird's eye and Streetside views). We will "visit" two or three sites, stateside and Germany.

Using the **People** (second menu), allows you to switch from Tree to Person views for your major editing. We will explore the process of using "naming conventions" to search your family lines in FTM. If time allows, we can also visit the Publish (charts and reports) and Web Search menus.

This will be a *live meeting* at the Kolping Klubhaus, but also offering guests a link via **Zoom** (see below) beginning at 2:00 pm
