





Christa received the Cincinnati Kolping Meritorious Service Award in 2009 and the National Kolping Distinguished Service Award in 2012. We extend our sympathies to Christa’s twelve children: Tom, Mike, Tim, Joe, Gerry, and John Olding; Cathy McFarland, Patty Williams, Mary Telinda, Lisa Lusby, Susie Knowles, and Cyndi Mapp, along with the entire Olding family.

John Langefeld, husband of Libby Langefeld and Kolping member for 63 years, passed away on February 21, 2025 at the age of 83. He was a member of the Schützen Club, winning the Marksman Award in January of 2002 and 2003. Our prayers go out to Libby and their children, Lisa Sloan, Christopher and Eric Langefeld, as well as the whole Langefeld family.

St. Joseph Mass – Sunday, April 6, 2025

St. Joseph, the patron saint of the Catholic Kolping Society, will be celebrated on Sunday, April 6, 2025. Saint Joseph embodies all that our Catholic Kolping Society is about. Why is he our patron saint? Here are some examples:

- St. Joseph is the patron saint of families – perfect for Kolping as we encourage family participation at our events. “In May 1999, we celebrated our 75th Anniversary. The Society has been blessed during the past 75 years. The membership has grown to more than 800 members. In addition to the regular members, there are many sub-groups such as Young Kolping, Senior Citizens, Sports Club, Shooting Club, the Kolping Band, and Sängerkor. A variety of activities are sponsored by the Society, affording wholesome recreation, athletics, education and musical and social entertainment. In all the events, the members carry out Father Kolping's intentions and ideals in a family-like spirit and harmony.” (From *History of Catholic Kolping Society*)
- St. Joseph – husband of Mary and role model for the father of families. No other person so possessed her esteem, subjection, and love as Joseph. This fatherhood, and official position of Saint Joseph in the Kingdom of God, has its true and particular foundation in a special way in the matrimonial union with Mary.
- St Joseph the Worker – Blessed Fr. Kolping exemplified this virtue when he led the movement for providing and promoting social support for workers in industrialized cities while also working to promote the dignities of workers in accordance with the social magisterium of the faith. He was called the Journeymen's Father.




