A Little Bit of History

On August 3, 1930, the grand opening of the Kolping House at 1523 Republic Street was held. About eight months before, the City of Cincinnati had accepted the Society's bid of \$5000.00 for the property. On May 29, 1958, ownership of the Kolping House was transferred to a new owner. The building had served the Society well for twenty-eight years. Now, fast forward fifty-eight years to 2016. The structure was obtained by a group of investors in 2015 for \$175,000. After more than a year of renovation work at a cost of more than a million dollars, the building went up for sale in August. If you would like to buy the first floor of the building, it costs only \$399,000. If you prefer one of the four condos on the second and third floors, they can be had for a mere \$309,000, or \$319,000 or \$329,000 or \$349,000.

While Nancy and I were writing the Kolping history, we were contacted by the new owners. They wanted to see pictures of the inside of the building so that they could keep some of the original characteristics as the renovation work proceeded. They contacted us again when the work was completed and invited us to see the finished product. We asked a small group of members to join us at an open house in the newly renovated building, one of which was longtime member, Henry Althoff. One of the others in attendance that day was Gottfried Schlembach. Both Henry and Gottfried lived in the building after their arrival in Cincinnati in the 1950s. Another member who lived there was John Tensing who, unfortunately, could not make the trip that day. It is rather unbelievable that something that was purchased for \$5000.00 at the end of 1929 can now be for sale for \$1,705,000.00. And it only took eighty-six years to appreciate that much!

Please be aware that all prepared or unprepared food to be stored in our kitchen refrigerator, freezer, or the walk-in cooler must be properly wrapped, identified, and labeled with the current date and the name of the group or individual who is responsible for the ultimate disposition of the food. This requirement particularly pertains to "leftovers" or "over-orders" from Society events, Tuesday worker lunches, Shooting Club refreshments, Sports Club events, and any other activities where members use the kitchen facilities.

Excess food still within its expiration date can be donated to charity. Contact either Doris Wilke or Beth Hoffman for details.

In addition, any member planning or chairing any event where beer is to be served, please review your beer requirements with Beth Hoffman. All beer ordering at Kolping is done by Beth.

Use of the Kolping facilities by its members is encouraged. For a scheduled member event, please review your date with Beth. And, after using our facilities, remember your parents' advice, "Leave the room in as good a condition or better than when you found it".
