## Message from Fr. Dan, Our Praeses

I went to the hospital yesterday and had a little surgery. Over three years ago, the cardiology team thought I might have atrial fibrillation. So they implanted a little device above my ribs, under my skin, to monitor my heart. Nothing appeared in over three years of monitoring. Now the battery wore out. When the doctor told me this news, he asked me if I wanted to have a new device implanted; I said no. When he asked if I wanted the device removed, I said yes. I figured I was better off without a foreign device on top of my ribs. Anyway, the doctor did not recommend another one.

Personal decisions like this are not easy to make, and I do have second thoughts. But the cardiologist saw nothing to recommend, except continuing my activities, staying on a healthy diet, and having regular checkups. He always says I am his healthiest patient, but I take that with a grain of salt.

As a priest, I have encountered situations where individuals were near death, including members of my own family. What a difference faith makes. Just today I received word that one of my fellow Franciscans, my co-worker in the Philippines, Max Hottel, had passed home to the Lord. He had worked many years in the Philippines, returned to the States and was working with Native Americans at an Arizona reservation south of Tucson. He continued his work until cancer took him down. When we last talked on the phone, he was in Hospice care in Tucson. He joined the saints in heaven, I feel sure.

While we are looking forward to Schützenfest, we should also remember our Kolping members in our prayers. Prayer can change us, if we allow God's grace to take hold of us, change us and prepare us for eternal life.
