Message from Fr. Dan, Our Praeses

By the time you read this March *Kolping Bulletin*, it will be the second week of Lent. Ash Wednesday and the First Sunday of Lent will be past. I suggest that we examine how we are doing this Lent.

As a child, I was told what I should “give up” starting with candy, movies and observing the Friday abstinence from meat. On Fridays my mother used to fry tuna or salmon croquets—we called them “pope burgers” because Catholics were not allowed to eat meat on the Fridays of Lent. On Sundays of Lent we were required to go to church for the Way of the Cross and Benediction. Absence required a written excuse from a parent. I guess we children did as we were told and followed the crowd.

But how should we adults grow in following Christ, choosing wisely?

The Church urges us to examine our consciences and focus on adding something positive, not just giving things up. Visiting the sick or trying to overcome bad habits, like anger or excessive drinking. Instead of “giving things up”, we are called to reform our lives and help those in need.

As members of the Kolping Society we are urged to follow the pattern of Christian life shown and taught by Fr. Kolping. He pointed out honest work, care for the poor, fulfilling our family duties and following Christ's example. Another way to sum up what Lent means is this—to put others first and put our over-blown egos aside.

Can we see that Lent calls us to live the Gospel, to open our hearts to others and to our God? That is the Jesus challenge—to take up our cross and follow him.




